# Regular Session Board Meeting Highlights February 3, 2020

The Gates County Board of Education met in regular session on Monday, February 3, 2020, at the Gates County Board of Education Central Office. Chairman Ray Felton called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. The following board members were present: Mr. Ray Felton, Mrs. Glendale Boone, Mr. Leslie Byrum and Mrs. Sallie Ryan. Mrs. Claire Whitehurst was absent due to illness.

Mrs. Glendale Boone made a motion to enter into closed session to discuss personnel as outlined in North Carolina General Statute 143-318.11(a)(6). Mrs. Sallie Ryan seconded the motion. There was no discussion, and the motion carried unanimously. The board members entered into closed session at 4:02 p.m.

Mr. Felton reconvened open session at 5:28 p.m., with the following board members present: Mr. Ray Felton, Mrs. Glendale Boone, Mr. Leslie Byrum and Mrs. Sallie Ryan.

Mr. Leslie Byrum made a motion to approve the agenda. Mrs. Glendale Boone seconded the motion. There was no discussion and the motion carried unanimously.

There was a moment of silence, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

There were no public comments.

Mrs. Lola Rountree, Director of Testing/Accountability, recognized Mrs. Joan Bundy, Guidance Counselor at Gates County High and Mrs. Susan Brown, teacher at Gates County High, for renewing their National Boards Certification.

Mrs. Amber Buxton, Principal at T.S. Cooper Elementary, provided information regarding the NC Check In 2. The Istation Diagnostic Reflection showed an upward trend in all student groups. Mrs. Buxton shared that teachers have been doing targeted small group work with each child, based on their areas of need. This information showed that the greatest opportunities for improvement continue to be in comprehension and vocabulary. To combat this, they are doing small group pull out tutoring two days a week, and whole group work on these skills as well. She provided her plans going forth, to continue to monitor the data, and adjust accordingly, to insure each child is given the tools necessary for success. Mrs. Buxton shared that the 5<sup>th</sup> grade has shown the most growth, and she asked Mrs. Mary Hobbs and Mrs. Lovie Roscoe, 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers, to share their strategies. They shared that they have utilized flexible grouping to allow students more individual instruction time and this has worked well. They both stressed the importance of having one to one conversations with the students, to allow their imput. Mrs. Buxton feels confident that T.S. Cooper Elementary students will show growth this year.

Dr. Paula Simpson, School Nutrition Director, had provided a report to the board prior to the meeting. This report compared the total number of meals served in January, 2019 and January, 2020. The report showed there has been an increase at some of the schools. Mr. Leslie Byrum noted that he had heard positive comments about the change in menus. She also provided a financial report.

Dr. Williams recognized Mrs. Crystal Harden, Director of Programs and Strategic Initiatives with the Morehead Planetarium and Science Center. Mrs. Harden shared that Gates County, through the Saunders Science Scholars Program, has received a \$500,000 donation from Steve Butts and Addie Miller that will allow this program to continue until 2026. The \$500,000 donation includes an expansion of the program to select an additional fifteen 6th grade students to participate in Saunders Science Scholars. Also, Elizabeth City State University, the Sloan Foundation and GlaxoSmithKline will be partnering with the Saunders Science Scholars Program to provide summer science camps for our schools for two years, and will provide funding to employ teachers and high school students to help with the camps. The Board is very appreciative of the generosity, and the dedication of Mrs. Harden and Mr. Benjamin Saunders, Jr.

Dr. Williams shared that Deja Gainey, Gates County High School graduate and former Student Advisor to the Board, was awarded a 2020 Charles B. Rangel International Affairs Fellowship, following a highly competitive nationwide contest. The Rangel Fellowship, funded by the U.S. Department of State and administered by Howard University, supports extraordinary individuals who want to pursue careers in the Foreign Service of the U.S. Department of State. We are very proud of Ms. Gainey.

Dr. Williams presented 2018-2019 certificates from the North Carolina School Boards Association Academy for School Boardsmanship to Leslie Byrum, Scholars Circle, Glendale Boone, Silver Award and Sallie Ryan, Certificate of Merit. Congratulations to these board members for their continued effort in pursuing school board training.

During the Report from the Board, Mrs. Ryan noted that she has been working with the Census Committee to inform the schools and community about the upcoming census. Mr. Byrum noted that it is very important that the census numbers are correct, since funding is based on these numbers. Mr. Felton noted that we are so close now to completion at Central Middle School. He is very pleased with how the project has progressed, even with the problems that we have encountered.

Mrs. Sandra Pittman, Finance Officer, was unable to provide reports due to the fact that the month just ended Friday. She will provide to the board at a later date.
