



Overview

On October 9, 2020, the Gates County Board of Education voted to remain on Plan C for the 2nd Nine Weeks with a commitment to prepare for Plan A.

On November 2, 2020, the Gates County Board of Education held a work session where Plan A for elementary schools and Plan B for the middle school and high school were presented by district and school administration.

School administrators collected information from families regarding their intent for their student's learning option if the school district moves to Plan A for the elementary schools and Plan B for the middle school and high school.

The following pages contains information from each school regarding the number of students opting for Face-to-Face instruction or virtual/remote only instruction. Based on these numbers, the middle school and high school have determined the number of days that Face-to-Face instruction can be offered. Administration have indicated if they will be able to offer virtual/remote only teaching opportunities to those teachers who are considered "at-risk" and have indicated they are concerned with Face-to-Face instruction.

Additionally, information regarding student meals and student transportation plans are included to assist with planning for cafeteria services and transportation services.

Participation: As of December 1, 2020, 164 students will be participating in the student nutrition program. Of the 164 students, 145 are Face-to-Face students and will receive breakfast and lunch at the school. 19 Virtual/Remote Only students have indicated they will participate in the student nutrition program and will have breakfast and lunch meals delivered to them.

Delivery: For students participating in the student nutrition program, Buckland Elementary School will deliver meals to students participating in Virtual/Remote Only Tuesdays through Fridays and to all students on Mondays.

Buckland Elementary School: Assigned two buses. The two buses will be able to accommodate the number of children requesting to ride the bus with one route and social distancing.

T.S. Cooper Elementary School: There are enough buses and drivers to accommodate the number of children requesting to ride the bus with one route and social distancing.

Gatesville Elementary School: There are enough buses assigned to Gatesville to cover the number of children requesting to ride the bus with one route and social distancing. However, Gatesville only has one bus driver at this time assigned to the school.

Central Middle School: There are enough buses assigned to Central Middle to cover the number of students requesting to ride the bus with one route and social distancing. Currently, CMS has 7 buses. 2 of the 7 buses assigned to CMS will more than likely be available for other coverages/shortages.

Gates County High School: Gates County High School will only need four buses to cover the number of students requesting to ride the bus with one route and social distancing. There are 6 buses assigned to Gates County High School. The two drives may be moved temporarily to Gatesville Elementary to cover their shortage.

Two weeks after Plan B has been implemented for the middle school and high school, an evaluation will be conducted to determine if school buses can be used to deliver meals.
